The Florida Keys National Wildlife Refuges:

Nearly a half a million acres of land and water habitats critical to the survival of numerous species of wildlife.

National Key Deer Refuge

Established in 1957 to protect the Key deer and other wildlife resources in the Florida Keys. Approximately 9,200 acres of land which is home to 23 endangered and threatened plant and animal species and hundreds of others. Includes pine rockland forests, tropical hardwood hammocks, freshwater wetlands, salt marshes wetlands and mangrove forests.

Crocodile Lake National Wildlife Refuge

One of the primary reasons this refuge was created was to protect and preserve critical habitat for the American crocodile. CLNWR contains acres of open water and a mosaic of habitat types including tropical hardwood hammock, mangrove forest, and salt marsh. These habitats are all vital for many unique species of plants and animals.

Great White Heron National Wildlife Refuge

Established in 1938 as a haven for great white herons, migratory birds, and other wildlife, this refuge includes almost 200,000 acres of open water and islands, known locally as the 'back country'. This refuge provides critical nesting, feeding, and resting areas for sea turtles as well as a multitude of bird species.

Key West National Wildlife Refuge

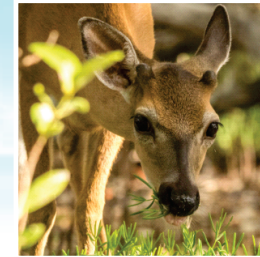
KWNWR includes the Marquesas Keys and 13 additional islands which are accessible only by boat and primarily dominated by mangrove plant communities.

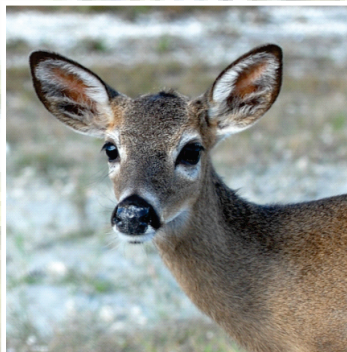
